THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Bartimaeus kept calling out to Jesus when people rebuked him and tried to silence him. Nevertheless, Bartimaeus persisted. Jesus called for him, asked what he wanted, and healed him, saying, “Your faith has saved you” (10:52). Bartimaeus persisted.

Jeremiah proclaims God's persistence for the people in exile. God promises to lead them back, console them, and deliver them, promises God also makes to us. In Jesus, Son of God and High Priest, God begins to fulfill those promises. Jesus heals the sick, give sight to the blind, forgives sinners, and is crucified because he persisted in trying to open eyes that were threatened by him and his message. Because Jesus knew the human condition, we can take courage by hearing him ask:” What do you want me to do for you?” Be honest. Let your faith impel you to find strength in weakness, courage in opposition, and a voice when people seek to silence you. Nevertheless, persist!

Persistent and loving God, you constantly seek us out. You have done great things for us and we are glad indeed. Help us to be as persistent in following you as you are in loving us.

When Bartimaeus was cured of his blindness he started to follow Jesus right away. When we can see ourselves and God clearly then we will also want to follow Jesus.



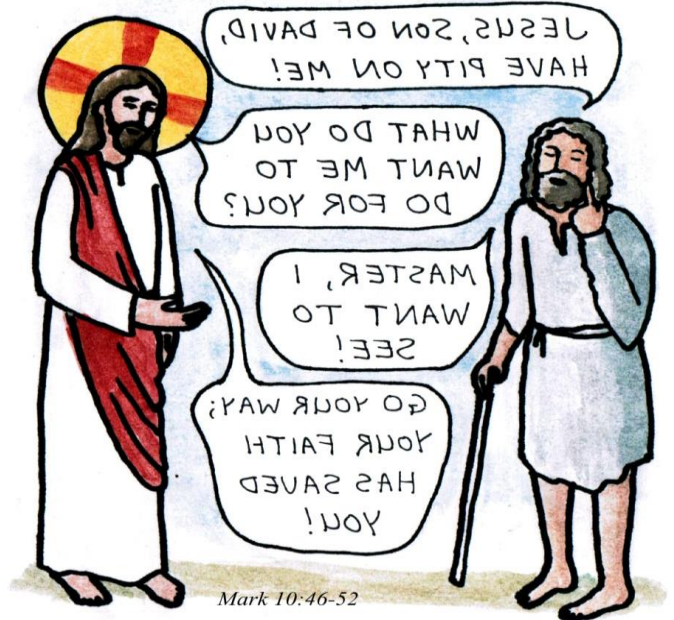
Before you go to bed, ask God to help you remember your sins today and then tell Him you're sorry for them.

Saint Narcissus of Jerusalem October 29

ST. NARCISSEUS WAS BORN AROUND THE END OF THE FIRST CENTURY AD. WHEN HE WAS ABOUT 80 HE WAS MADE THE BISHOP OF JERUSALEM.

HE WAS KNOWN FOR HIS MIRACLES, ESPECIALLY FOR ONCE TURNING WATER INTO OIL FOR THE CHURCH LAMPS.

HE WAS ALSO KNOWN FOR BEING STRICT ABOUT CHURCH LAWS.

BUT THEN HE WAS FOUND INNOCENT. MEANWHILE OTHER BISHOPS HAD LOOKED AFTER JERUSALEM.

THE PEOPLE WELCOMED HIM BACK AS THOUGH HE HAD BEEN RAISED FROM THE DEAD!
