EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have often sung the conclusion words of today's Gospel: "I am the bread of life; Whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst," The crowd mistakenly thought that Moses gave their ancestors the bread of heaven. The Israelites needed the reminder that the Lord gave them bread to eat. Like them, we can forget that Jesus feeds us to become one with us, and bake us into bread for others. Too often we mistakenly view the Eucharist as something meant only for us to receive. We forget that celebrating the Eucharist transforms us to become what we eat and drink, the Body and Blood of Christ. We get so caught up in the sign of Christ's "Real Presence," we forgot that Jesus feeds us to become really present to others through the way we live.

Like the Ephesians, we need renewal. We need to put on a new self and live in righteousness and truth so others can find the words that come from the mouth of God in our witness. Today's Collect reminds us that we are the Lord's servants. Jesus feeds us with his very self to become what we eat, the Bread of Life, broken in service. Jesus quenches our thirst to become what we drink, the Blood of Christ, poured out in love. When we become what we eat and drink, we declare the glorious deeds of the Lord and make the wonders of God has wrought visible. When we are fed by God with food that endures forever, then through us people can come to Jesus and never hunger or thirst again.

Holy God, you gave our ancestors manna in the desert and you continue to offer us bread from heaven. Help us express our gratitude for that bread of life by feeding those we meet with your presence, which notices their hungers and shares your gift with them.

> All your life there are things you want that you think will make you happy. Have you ever gotten something


> > that you really wanted? It probably made you really happy for a while. But we can only be really satisfied if we have God living in us.
