TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The man in today's Gospel reflects the wisdom of his day. He obeyed the commandments, and was considered blessed because he was wealthy. Jesus asking him to sell what he had and to give to the poor made him sad, and confused the disciples. Wasn't wealth a sign of blessing? It can be, but when one holds on to it, there is less room for God. Valuing money more than God keeps us from the freedom we need to let go of whatever gets in God's way. God's wisdom offers something greater than wealth. It offers health, comeliness, light, and fullness of life. When we seek and live God's Wisdom, we find true freedom. Seeking God's Will requires discernment, and discernment requires a type of indifference.

St. Francis de Sales taught: "The indifferent heart is like a ball of wax in God's hands... It does not place its love in the things God wills but in the Will of God who wills them... Indifference must be practiced in things that concern natural life, such as health, sickness, beauty, ugliness, weakness, and strength... concern civil life, such as honors, rank, and wealth... spiritual life, such as dryness, consolation, relish, and aridity, in actions and in sufferings; in sum, in every event of every kind." (*Treatise on the Love of God*, Book 9, Chapter 4). Make your heart a ball of wax. Give it to God. God will work that wax and help you find wisdom where you least expect.

Wisdom of God, empty me of whatever gets in the way of seeking you alone. Take my heart and enfold it, caress it, and stretch it to be open to your Wisdom, in whatever my life entails. Help me to seek your Will and live what you teach me.




