TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



My Brothers and Sisters in Christ

“Understanding the Word” today makes an important distinction. The Pharisees are grounded in Moses: “Moses permitted a husband...” (Mark 10:4). Jesus is grounded in God: “God made them male and female...” (Mark 10:6). Like Jesus, the teachings of Moses and the prophets are meant to ground us in God. Instead of asking, “What would Jesus do?” we should ask, “What does God ask us to do?” Seek to know the will of God and then do it.

What is God’s will? In Genesis God makes clear that we are not to be alone. So find suitable companionship, partnership, support. God is a community of three persons, and we likewise are to live community, with all its give and take. What is God’s will? That we empty ourselves, live sacrificial love, like Christ, who “‘for a little while’ was made ‘lower than the angels’”.

Sacrificial love is selfless and unconditional. What is God’s will? That we be committed and work through tough times. Don’t give up on each other until it is clear no solution can be found. What is God’s will? That we be like children. They are open, receptive, and trusting, until life events tarnish those qualities. In Jesus’ day, children had no rights and were among the least of all. So pay attention to the least among us.

We come to know the will of God in scripture, the liturgy, Church teaching, and life events. God is with us even when life deals us a blow, like a ruptured relationship. Look for God. Ask yourself, “What would God ask me to do?” Then, do it.

Almighty God, in Jesus you made your will visible. Help us turn toward your Christ in your word, the liturgy, and Church teaching. Open our minds and hearts, that in coming to know your will, we might live it each and every day.

Saint John Henry Newman October 9

JOHN HENRY NEWMAN WAS BORN IN 1801, THE ELDEST OF SIX CHILDREN. HIS FATHER WAS A BANKER IN ENGLAND.

THE FAMILY WAS PROTESTANT, BUT JOHN HENRY TOOK HIS FAITH SERIOUSLY.

HE STUDIED HARD AND BECAME AN ANGLICAN PRIEST.

FOR MANY YEARS HE TAUGHT IN UNIVERSITIES, BUT HE KEPT STUDYING AS WELL.

EVENTUALLY HE SAW THAT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH WAS THE ONE TRUE CHURCH.

The saints prove that the Catholic Church is true!

HE WAS ORDAINED A CATHOLIC PRIEST AND HELPED START A CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY IN IRELAND.

FATHER JOHN HENRY WAS MADE A CARDINAL. HE WROTE ABOUT FORTY BOOKS IN HIS LIFE, AND 21,000 LETTERS BEFORE HE DIED IN 1890.

SAINT JOHN HENRY NEWMAN LEARNED THE TRUTH ABOUT THE CATHOLIC FAITH BECAUSE HE HONESTLY STUDIED ABOUT THE HISTORY OF THE CHURCH. WE SHOULD FOLLOW HIS EXAMPLE AND LEARN ALL WE CAN ABOUT GOD AND THE CHURCH. ONE GOOD WAY IS TO LEARN ABOUT THE SAINTS!

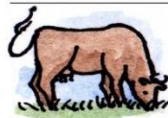
